# **Provider Recruitment Grant Program**

#### Purpose

- Support provider recruitment efforts to expand HPSJ/MVHP's contracted provider network
- Expand access to providers in specialized services for HPSJ/MVHP members

#### **Grant Qualifications**

- Be a new provider to the HPSJ/MVHP network
- Provide healthcare services at a professional office or clinic within the HPSJ/MVHP service area
- Be a licensed practitioner
- Be Medi-Cal enrolled as Ordering, Referring, and Prescribing (ORP) practitioner
- Meet and complete credentialing requirements
- Employed as full (minimum 30 hours per week), part-time (minimum of 20 hours per week and less than 30), half-time (minimum of 10 hours a week and less than 20 hours)
- Maintain good standing for the entire grant term

## **Program Structure**

- Application window opens two (2) times a year
  - January 1<sup>st</sup> January 31st (Prior year July December recruits)
  - July 1<sup>st</sup> July 31<sup>st</sup> (Prior January June recruits)
- Executed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between HPSJ/MVHP and hiring entity
- Once MOU is executed, hiring entity completes and submits the HPSJ/MVHP Provider Recruitment Grant Application Form for each recruit
- Out of Scope urgent care centers, ambulatory surgical centers, hospital-based specialties; specialists that practice out of area or out of country; specialties where the health plan has not identified access issues



### Payment Structure (Full Time)

<ul> <li>Hard to recruit specialist MD/DO, which includes:</li> <li>Plastic surgery, reconstructive surgery</li> <li>Endocrinology</li> <li>Rheumatology</li> <li>Oncology – Hematology</li> <li>Psychiatry</li> <li>Neurology</li> </ul>	\$150,000 grant funding
All other specialist MD/DO (e.g., GI, Allergy/Immunology, Urology) • Specific specialties noted in MOU	\$125,000 grant funding
PCP MD/DO • Family Medicine • Internal Medicine • Pediatrics • OBGYN	\$100,000 grant funding
PA/NP/MFT/LCSW/LPCC/Substance Abuse Counselor/Behavioral Health Counselor/CNM/Medication Assisted Counselor for SUD (mild to moderate)	\$50,000 grant funding

NOTE: Full-Time (100%); Part-Time (75%); Half-Time (50%)

# **Payment Distribution**

- Two (2) equal distributions:
  - End of program year (PY) 1:50%
  - $_{\odot}$  End of program year (PY) 2: 50%
- Example: \$150,000 grant funding for endocrinologist
   End of PY 1: \$75,000
   End of PY 2: \$75,000
